The Opportunity Atlas is a map tool that shows how children from low-income families have historically fared as adults, based on income, education, and incarceration rates, depending on where they grew up. This helps identify neighborhoods that may offer better long-term outcomes for your family

Neighborhoods with higher opportunity scores are linked to:

- Better schools
- Lower poverty rates
- · Higher incomes in adulthood for children raised there
- Lower incarceration rates

When using your voucher, consider searching in one of these high-opportunity areas.

Other definitions used in the Opportunity Atlas maps (below) include:

- Poverty rate the ratio of the population whose income falls below a defined poverty line.
- **Fraction Non-White** refers to the percentage of a neighborhood's population that does not identify as "non-Hispanic White alone".
- **Social capital**—the strength of an individual's social network and community—has been identified as a potential determinant of outcomes ranging from education to health.






Heath, OH: Poverty Rate in 2012 - 2016






#### Reynoldsburg, OH: Poverty Rate in 2012 - 2016






